Mount Aloysius Board of Director's & CEO Update Submitted by Justin Gall, CEO

It is my pleasure to provide you with an update on activities the Board of Directors and the Mount Aloysius Team have been undertaking over the last few months. I would like to first thank each of you for your support and understanding during restrictions placed upon us due to COVID-19. With the onset of COVID-19 in early March, our team had to make unpopular decisions regarding our response to ensure we were following orders from local, state, and federal Government entities. At Mount Aloysius we saw changes with visitation, resident outings, public facility use, in addition to modifications of how our staff interact and provide support. Although this has been burdensome and may have caused some frustrations, I feel confident all changes were made in the best interest of the safety and well-being of our staff and residents. Your understanding during this time has been appreciated and we are looking forward to beginning the process of redefining what services look like as restrictions placed upon us are lessoned. We will be planful and timely to ensure this is completed in the safest way possible. Finally, if you run into a staff member of Mount Aloysius, be sure to thank them as all of this would not have been possible without their compassion and dedication to the men we serve.

In other news, we continue to move forward with implementation of our strategic plan and are focusing on developing relationships within our community. Mount Aloysius has had the opportunity to sponsor multiple local school districts and their sports programming as a way to give back to our community. We were proud to support our local youth and bring awareness to what Mount Aloysius stands for. Over the past months, we have also been visiting with local County Boards of Developmental Disabilities in Southeastern Ohio. The purpose of these visits was to build productive relationships, learn what gaps they experience, and how Mount Aloysius can be useful to them. The process of outlining enhancements and additions to our service provisions are underway, moving us closer to building a campus of quality care to meet all needs of individuals with developmental disabilities. At the same time, we will be refining our mission and vision to truly



reflect the wonderful work our staff are doing and to lead us into the future.

Finally, as you are aware, in November of 2019 Mount Aloysius celebrated 50 years of dedicated service to individuals with developmental disabilities. Following this event, I am proud to inform you Mount Aloysius was chosen by the Perry County Chamber of Commerce to receive the 2019 Presidential Award for 50 years of quality service in Perry County. This was exciting news and further drives home the value Mount Aloysius brings to our community.
